On April 1st 2024, the regular Board of Directors meeting of the Southern Nevada Gem and Mineral Society was called to order at the Eagle's Lodge at 4:03 PM by the President. All Board members except the Two Year Board and Parliamentarian were present. The pledge of allegiance to the flag was recited.

Minutes: The minutes of the February 29th 2024 meeting were approved as read.

Treasurers Report: Treasurer Dave Ford reported the checking account balance is \$23,244 with the \$4,033 decrease due to advance expenditures for the Viva Las Vegas Rocks Show. The investments balance is \$124,115.

Lapidary Shop Report: All equipment is up and running. The Board discussed possible excessive wear on wheels and ways to monitor it.

Unfinished Business: Andrea Packo reports that the shop lease was renewed for a 5 year term. After negotiations the terms are 38% increase from the previous rent, with a 4% yearky increase and one free month.

Shows: Orville Wiemers reported on the Boulder City, NV Spring Jamboree Show and the Viva Las Vegas Rocks Show: Jamboree Show – all inside booths are sold and there will be outside booths. Viva Las Vegas Rocks Show – the floor plan is complete and the contract with Santa Fe Station has been finalized.

There will be a Rock Swap at the Shop on April 14th..

On April 1st, 2024, the regular meeting of the Southern Nevada Gem and Mineral Society was called to order at 6 PM by the President. The Secretary was present. The pledge of allegiance to the flag was recited.

The minutes of the March 4th, 2024 meeting were approved as read.

Treasurers Report: The checking balance as of end of March was \$23,244 with the \$4,033 decrease due to advance expenditures for the Viva Show. The Investments balance was \$124,115. An internal audit was conducted as required by SNGMS Bylaws, with a couple of discrepancies noted.

Membership Report: Claudia Crouse reports that the membership is 499 adults and 76 kids.

Lapidary Shop Report: "Chops" Wenzl reported that equipment is up and running. Thanks to all the Shop volunteers, and more volunteers are needed.

Sunshine Report: Mary Beth Paladino shared news from the membership. The Sunshine report is available in the Polished Slab.

Kids Club Report: Wendy Dresser reported on the Kid's Club activities, thanking all who have helped (especially the Egg Hunt help) and donated. Special thanks to Cliff Jackson who talked about fluorescent minerals and presented specimens to the kids. There will be a field trip to the Ice Age Fossil State Park this month, no meeting in May due to Mother's Day, and the next meeting at the Shop will be June 9th.


A Rock Swap and BarBQue is scheduled for April 14, 2024 at the Lapidary Shop.

Rock Spotlight: Diorite

Diorite is a coarse-grained igneous rock that forms deep beneath the Earth's surface when magma cools and solidifies. Diorite's name comes from the Greek words "dios" meaning "belonging to the gods" and "rite," which translates to "rock." This name reflects the rock's use in ancient sculpture and architecture. It is a pretty and durable rock.

Diorite is speckled due to the interlocking arrangement of its mineral grains. It typically has a medium to coarse grain size, which indicates the rock cooled slowly beneath the Earth's surface. Slower cooling allows bigger mineral crystals to form. Diorite's color ranges from light to dark gray.

The main minerals found in diorite are plagioclase feldspar and hornblende. Other minerals, such as biotite mica and quartz, may also be present in smaller amounts.

Throughout history, diorite has been used to create monuments, statues, and sculptures. It can be intricately carved,

and it resists weathering, so works of art made from diorite stand the test of time. Diorite's hardness and durability make it



suitable for use in building construction. It is often cut into blocks and used as a building stone for walls, facades, and floors. With its attractive patterns and colors, diorite can be polished and used in jewelry.




Lapidary/Jewelry Studio Tips & Tricks Dressing A Silicone Rubber Wheel For Jewelry Making

Silicone rubber wheels can be used with a flexshaft or Dremel rotary tool to polish gemstones, glass, bone, porcelain, and metal jewelry.

For the most effective use, wheels need to be dressed regularly so they keep their shape.

Dressing a wheel:

- Removes clogged grit
- Ensures the wheel maintains a sharp edge
- Can be done at any time during the lifespan of a wheel.
- Should be done when the wheel has become worn or dirty.

A knife-edge rubber wheel works best when it really is a knife edge, and a flat wheel works best when it has that perfectly flat edge. So, if you find your silicone rubber wheel edges are rounding and losing crisp definition, use a diamond plate, or a sandpaper stick, to return them to their original shape.


Load the wheel into your flexshaft, Dremel, or other rotary tool. Turn on the flexshaft or the Dremel so the wheel starts rotating. Hold the wheel so it touches a diamond plate or a sanding stick at the correct angle - a 90 degree angle for a flat wheel, or a 45 degree angle for a knife edge. Hold the wheel against the abrasive for a few seconds to get a flat edge or a knife edge. You can buy cheap diamond plates from Temu or Amazon designed for sharpening knives that are fine for dressing wheels.



DIY Sanding Stick Made from a Paint Stirrer, Sandpaper, and Tape

You can make sanding sticks by wrapping sandpaper around a wooden paint stirrer and taping the top and bottom edges of the sand paper to the stirrer. You can tear off strips of the sandpaper as it wears out to

expose clean sandpaper. Write the grit on the bottom of the stick with a felt-tip



Diamond Plates for Sharpening Knifes
Can Be Used to Dress Rubber Wheels

The meeting was packed with other famous people including Dora Tucker of *Desert Magazine* fame, Betsy O'Reilly Gamble who was a hostess for Franklin Roosevelt during the Dam dedication, and Dr. William S. Park who helped excavate Gypsum Cave. The group formed the Mineralogical Society of Southern Nevada. Every Sunday was a field trip until Pearl Harbor. On the day of the bombing, the group was in Gypsum Cave and didn't know about the attack until they got home. (*The digging continues next month!*)




Did You Know?

Mineral Musings Johnson Farm Fossils

In February 2000, Dr. Sheldon Johnson (an eye doctor) was working on his farm in St. George, Utah. He found 3-D casts of dinosaur footprints on the underside of a sandstone block.

More fossils of fish, plants, and invertebrates, rare dinosaur teeth and bones, and thousands of additional tracks made by different animals were identified. The large number and types of fossils gave paleontologists enough information to reconstruct a 200-million-year-old ecosystem in the St. George area.

To preserve the dinosaur trackways for scientific and educational purposes, Dr. Johnson and his wife, LaVerna, donated the site to the City of St. George. The city, local businesses, federal and state governments, and paleontologists created a museum over the tracks. Scientists from all over the world have visited the site to learn how dinosaurs walked and behaved.




Invertebrate Trace Fossils at Johnson Farm Photo by Spencer G. Lucas


One important discovery at the Farm is a trackway showing extremely rare crouching and tail drag traces. These tracks

were made by a dinosaur that first sat on the ground, then lumbered forward, and sat down again. Later, the dinosaur climbed up a sand bar, scraping its tail on the ground as it walked, leaving drag marks along the trackway.

The most common track is a four to eight inch-long, three-toed print. The prints were probably made by slender, meat-eating dinosaurs like the 10-foot-long Megapnosaurus. Larger 13-18 inch-long, three-toed prints are thought to be made by a large meat-eating dinosaur like the crested Dilophosaurus. Dilophosaurus grew up to 6½ feet tall and 19 feet long, and weighed 900 pounds. Many, small non-dinosaur tracks have also been found, including those of crocodiles and horseshoe crabs.
