Ruby, the July Birthstone

Ruby is the July birthstone. The name comes from the Latin word "ruber," meaning red. The most expensive rubies are deep red with a hint of purple, called "pigeon's blood." Ruby is a variety of the mineral corundum. Its color comes from trace amounts of the element chromium. The more chromium, the stronger the red. Rubies are often heat treated to enhance their red color. They can be faceted or cut as cabochons. Cabochon cuts are usually done to show a ruby's

star.

Rubies are found in Myanmar, Vietnam, Mozambique, Thailand, Cambodia, Afghanistan, Tajikistan, Pakistan, Sri Lanka, Kenya, Tanzania and Madagascar. Early explores in Nevada mistakenly identified garnets from Elko County as rubies.

Rubies can be cleaned with warm soapy water and a soft brush.





Lapidary/Jewelry Studio Tips & Tricks Marking Rough Cabochon Forms on a Slab

- Aluminum or Brass Scribe. These scribes are basically thin rods of aluminum or brass sharpened to a point. You draw with them like pencils, and they leave a thin mark on the slab. You choose which one to use, depending on the color of your slab. These scribes are the basic tools for making the outline of cabochon shapes on slabs. The scribed lines will not wash off during sawing or grinding. The scribes can be sharpened with a file or a grinding wheel. They are available at multiple web sites, and of course, you can make your own!
- 2) Sharpie Oil Based Paint Marker. Sharpie makes oil-based felt-tip paint markers in lots of colors and sizes. These markers are somewhat slow to dry, somewhere in the vicinity of 15 minutes in our climate. Although the marks hold up well in water-lubricated cab machines, the lines tend to blur and dissolve in oil-lubricated trim saws.
- 3) Dykem Tuff Guy Marker. The Dykem Tuff Guy marker is a heavy-duty, permanent ink marker. It is resistant to most cutting fluids, so it doesn't blur or dissolve in trim saw cutting oils or in water. It dries quickly and comes in a variety of colors (green, red, yellow, blue, black, and white). It only comes in a medium point, so if you want a fine line this marker may not meet your needs. The tips are replaceable, and are sold separately for about 50 cents each (the prices vary

widely, so check around). The marker itself is on the expensive side. Tuff Guy markers cost about \$9 -\$13 each, depending on shipping charges. They are widely available on the web. Dykem makes several different kinds of markers, so be sure to get **Tuff Guy** since not all Dykem markers resist cutting oils.

Did You Know?

The SNGMS Lapidary Shop has six cabochon machines. Three of them are set up for cutting soft stones like turquoise and chrysocolla, and three are set up for cutting hard stones like agate. As you face the row of machines in the shop, the ones on the right (sitting on the lower tables) are for soft stones, and the ones on the left (sitting on the taller tables) are for hard stones.

Mineral Musings The Rock Cycle


Have you ever heard of the rock cycle? It's the journey that rocks take from the Earth's surface down to its center and back up again. It's a slow process, and it's fascinating.

Rocks form deep inside the Earth and then they move around and sometimes change before making their way up to the surface. Eventually, they'll go back down below the ground again. The rock cycle involves both rocks and minerals. Minerals are solids with a specific crystal shape, chemical composition, and atomic structure. Rocks usually contain a mix of two or more minerals that have been combined through geological processes.

There are three types of rocks: igneous, sedimentary, and metamorphic. Igneous rocks form when hot, molten rock solidifies. Sedimentary rocks are made up of layers of sand, mud, and pebbles that have been compressed over time. Metamorphic rocks form when existing rocks are exposed to high temperatures and pressures.

In the rock cycle, rocks are constantly being transformed between these three types. Any type of rock can be converted into any other type, or into another rock of the same type. It's a never-ending process!

The rock cycle is shown in this diagram (www.gsi.ie/en-ie/education/rocks-minerals-and-gems/Pages/The-rock-cycle.aspx):



The rock cycle is a natural process that helps maintain the Earth's surface. Mountains are formed through this process, and it's pretty amazing how rocks can change and transform over time. So, next time you see a rock, think about its journey through the rock cycle!
