#### How to stabilize your slabs and cabs, by Peggy Sue and Bill Moore

When we first started making cabochons, we, like everyone else, were frustrated with material that was too soft or unstable to hold together.

We first tried Opticon. We bought a little toaster oven to process slabs and cabochons, but were not happy with the results as it never hardened to our satisfaction.

The best advice we received came from our friends in Kingman, AZ, who were into working with turquoise. We followed their advice and have worked out how to get the most out of our efforts.

Here is how it works:

Buy 330 Epoxy. It comes in a 1 oz. box or in two 8 oz. bottles. (see picture)

Use all of the two ½ oz. tubes, or equivalent from the larger bottles, by mixing it in a wide mouth glass jar with something like a popsicle stick.

Add approximately 1 cup of acetone. Mix this together until fully blended.

Put in your cabochons and/or slabs, making sure that your material is covered by the liquid.

Cover the jar tightly with the lid and put it into a refrigerator for 1 week. Each day I pick it up and slosh everything around to make sure that the mix is getting everywhere on the slabs and cabochons. The reason you keep it in the refrigerator is to retard the hardening process and allow the epoxy to penetrate into the material.

When you take it out at the end of the week, place the items on a cookie cooling rack or a classifier and let dry for a day in the sun. You can now add a second batch of slabs and cabs to your jar of left over liquid. I usually run batches in the same liquid until I don't think it is working any more, at which time I put in more epoxy mix.

I have had great success with this process but remember, some material is just too crumbly to work with, no matter what you do.

silversmithed and wire wrapped jewelry, rock


slabs, unfinished stones, and more are usually available. It is a good time to chat with other members and catch up on their latest creations.

I have sent out our notes on the Holiday Party, and we will discuss further at the General Meeting.



## **Field Trip Fun**

We love our field trips. We love collecting and just the enjoyment of being outside in Nevada. I wanted to take the time to talk about driving off road safely and some good safety tips for our members to follow. Prepare your vehicle: always have a full tank of fuel at the start of any trip. Bring extra fuel in a safe can if necessary. Check your tires: old tires, even with good tread, can be brittle and puncture easily. All terrain tires work great. I used to have Kevlar-wrapped knobby off-road tires on the jeep but developed a very severe "death wobble" as they wore down. The problem was solved when the guys at Discount Tire recommended Falken LT265/75R16. I have gone over the roughest roads that we will travel as rock hounds and aired-down to run Dumont Dunes with those tires and never had a problem. Bottom line...go high on the ply when picking out your new tires. Tell your tire guy what you intend to be doing with your vehicle.

Buying something to take off road? 4 Wheel drive and high clearance is the way to go. High Clearance is more important than 4 wheel drive, as we always have wash outs to contend with. All wheel drive is not the same as 4 wheel drive. If you need to traverse a climb that is in the dirt, you may want to be able to go into 4 wheel low, 3rd gear, to make that climb. Talk to the 4 wheelers before you make your purchase.

Don't get left behind! When we are keeping the group together on the highways and paved roads, we want to keep a tight group. Don't lag behind and miss a turn off. If you have a problem, call the leaders with your cell phone and let them know what is going on. If the group is off-road, you need to stay together, but don't tail gate. When climbing a hill, give the guy in front of you time to reach the top (just in case he can't make it and needs to back up) before you go. If you have a problem, immediately turn on your flashers on and stop. The guy in front of you needs to stop and put on his flashers and so forth, until the entire group has stopped! You never know who might have the right tool to help with the problem. If you allow the vehicles in front of you to continue ahead, you may cause everyone behind you to lose the group. We rarely have cell service off-road. It is the responsibility of every driver to keep track of the guy behind him. If he has stopped, put your flashers on to alert the guy ahead of you, and stop and see what is going on.

Get a CB radio: If you have a CB radio, you can let everyone know what is going on. Sometimes you just need to stop to relieve yourself behind a tree. Many Rock and Gem Clubs require their members to have CB radios. They don't have to be bulky. Get one where the works are in the hand set. You can use an installed antenna or a magnetic one.

Off road tow service: Just so you know, AAA won't go off road to tow you. Bring a heavy duty tow strap and battery jump cables in your "go kit".

We have never lost anyone and we don't want it to happen in the future. Follow the field trip guidelines from our website and talked to the experienced rock-hounds about their experiences. It will assist you in being ready for a safe and fun outing.
