SNGMS Board Meeting Minutes for 9/7/2023

On September 7, 2023, the regular Board of Directors meeting of the Southern Nevada Gem and Mineral Society was called to order at Desert Art Supply in Henderson at 4:12 pm by the President. All Board members except the Past President were present. The pledge of allegiance to the flag was recited. The minutes of the August 3rd 2023 meeting were approved as read.

Treasurers Report: The treasurer reported account balances with a checking balance of \$26,098.93

Shop Report: The Shop Open House and New Member Orientation was a success with good attendance and participation. Andrea Kincannon stated that she will have to step back from being Shop Manager due to family obligations.

Unfinished Business: The board reviewed information gathered about the club investments and after discussion it was unanimously decided to propose to the general membership that 1) the current bond be sold and proceeds rolled into the investment funds. 2) the \$100,000 be invested incrementally in CDs with staggered maturation dates so that there will be more liquidity should it be needed. Peggy Sue Moore so motioned, seconded by Del Walkenshaw, and approved by the Board. Dale Bright provided updates on progress with the Viva Las Vegas Show announcing that we have 46 paid vendors and advertisement of the show is progressing well.


New Business: Peggy Sue Moore proposed, seconded by Bob Belcher, and approved by the Board, that "T-shirts be reordered for sale at the Viva Las Vegas Show"

Wayne Muth asked for a date for the next Rock Swap to be held at the Shop. September 30th was selected and Wayne will organize it.

Andrea Packo nominated Del Walkenshaw for Lifetime membership. The Board approved of presentation of the nomination to the membership. Life membership is a distinguished and privileged title extended to an adult member with a minimum of 10 years membership in the SNGMS, who have held a Board position or committee chair; whose nomination has been presented by a SNGMS member to the Board of Directors, in a written statement of qualifications and attributes, and presented to the membership and approved by a majority vote.

A new Spring Jamboree Chair and a Nomination/Election Committee Chair are needed.

The meeting was adjourned at 5:23 PM.

SNGMS General Meeting Minutes for 9/11/2023

On September 11th, 2023, the regular meeting of the Southern Nevada Gem and Mineral Society was called to order at 6 PM by the President. The Secretary was present. The pledge of allegiance to the flag was recited. The minutes of the August 7th 2023 meeting were approved as read.

Treasurers Report: The treasurer reported account balances: Checking account: \$2,789.19 as of end of August and \$28,951.95 as of meeting date. There is \$124,252.86 in the bond/money market account.

Membership Report: There are 567 adult and 123 child members.

Kids Club Report: Wendy Dresser reported on the Kid's Club activities. She thanked members for their continuing support, and special thanks to Mary Beth Paladino for her continuing help with the club. The kids will continue working on their Gem Lore & Legends badge. They have tickets available for gift baskets at the Viva Las Vegas Show.

Shop Report: Andrea Kinkannon reported that all equipment is up and running. The Open House had good participation and engagement. There will be a Rock Swap at the end of the month. The donated Genie cab machine will be auctioned this month. Shop volunteers are needed to supervise, teach a class, clean, etc.

Sheri Johnson, current RMFMS President, and SNGMS member discussed the Rocky Mountain and American Federation shows she attended this year, and future show locations. She presented plaques to Lorrilee Stackhouse, SNGMS Webmaster, for first place in the Rocky Mountain and American Federation website contests.

Presentation: Ary Udry discussed Martian Meteorites, showing us examples and discussing how they are identified and what information they hold about Mars.

Sunshine Report: Sadly our Sunshine Chair, Beth Jones, was absent as she and her family have COVID.

Unfinished Business: Dale Bright discussed the Viva Las Vegas Show progress. Advertisement is going well.

Cabochon Contest: The Cab Contest theme was Coral. First place was Lloyd Chayette, second place Ron Mazz. Next month's subject will be Shark.

SNGMS Financial Investments: Orville Weimers, Vice-President, presented the Board's recommendation: 1) the current bond be sold and proceeds rolled into the investment funds. 2) the \$100,000 be invested incrementally in CDs with staggered maturation dates so that there will be more liquidity should it be needed. Wayne Muth asked that the decision for incremental investment be reviewed periodically. Wendy Dresser proposed, seconded by Romy Umholtz, and approved by the membership that the presented plan be followed.

New Business: Andrea Packo nominated Del Walkenshaw for Lifetime Membership starting in October, when he is eligible. Lloyn Chayette proposed, seconded by Wendy Dresser, and enthusiastically approved by the Membership that Del be granted Lifetime Membership. Wayne Muth proposed, seconded by Wendy Dresser, and approved by the membership, that "\$1,527.80 by used to purchase additional T-shirts for sale by the club." SNGMS elections are approaching. Let a Board member know if you are interested in being on the Election Committee or if you are interested in running for a Board position. Also needed are a Shop Manager and a Spring Jamboree chair.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:48 PM.


Finding the SNGMS Lapidary Shop


Location of the Eagles' Lodge



Lapidary/Jewelry Studio Tips & Tricks **Faceting Diagram Basics**

What is Faceting?



Rough Stone with Faceted Product

much stone to cut off. The individual faceter must decide how much to cut

There is a vocabulary used to describe the facets. The vocabulary is important because it clearly describes how the stone is to be cut. A list of common terms, and a sample diagram of gem proportions with facet

Crown: The top section of the stone, just above the girdle. **Pavilion:** The bottom section of the stone, just below the girdle. **Girdle:** A line that divides the stone into a top and bottom section.





Mineral Musings Epidote: A Closer Look



Epidote (pronounced ep-peh-dote) is an outstanding display mineral. The most desirable form is elongated crystals that are usually shiny green, and often interconnected. Epidote is a rock-forming mineral. Two rock types that contain epidote are epidosite and unakite. The word "epidote" comes from the Greek word "epidosis" which means "addition" because one side of the ideal crystal is longer than the other (sort of a convoluted reason for the name, right?).

What is Epidote?

Epidote is a mineral containing calcium, aluminum, and iron silicate.^{*} It forms as crystals in several shades of green, yellow, brown, and black.



How Does Epidote Form?

Epidote forms in metamorphic and igneous rocks, and where igneous and sedimentary rock containing calcium carbonate come into contact. The crystal faces are often striped, and they are often twinned.

Epidosite is a metamorphic rock containing mainly epidote, with small amounts of quartz. Unakite is a metamorphic rock that is altered granite containing pink orthoclase feldspar, green epidote, and generally colorless quartz.

Where is Epidote Found?

The most important place in the United States for epidote crystals is Green Monster Mountain on Prince of Wales Island, Alaska. Colorado, New Jersey, and Vermont have some epidote. Epidote is also found in Calaveras County, California and Death Valley. In Nevada, epidote crystals are mined from the Hawthorne and Julie claims in Mineral County. Europe, Africa, krista, and South America are all sources of epidote.

Epidote Characteristics

Transparent forms of epidote can be strongly pleochroic, with a greenish color on one angle and brownish color on the other angle. It has a hardness of 6 - 7 on the Mohs scale. Epidote is sensitive to heat and acid. The amount of iron in the mineral controls the color.

Uses of Epidote

Epidote has no use as an industrial mineral. Epidote is occasionally faceted as a gemstone, but it is usually collected as a mineral specimen.

Sapphire, the September Birthstone



The September birthstone is sapphire. Sapphire is usually the blue variety of corundum (ruby is the red variety), but it comes in other colors. Violet, green, yellow, orange, pink, and purple colors are known as "fancy sapphires." Iron and titanium are responsible for the blue color, and the more iron present, the darker the blue color of a sapphire. Yellow and orange sapphires get their color from iron and chromium, while pink sapphires are a result of high amounts of chromium. A purple color is a combination of all three trace elements.

Sapphire typically occurs with ruby deposits, but in much smaller quantities than its red counterpart. Kashmir, Myanmar, and Sri Lanka are three historically important sources for sapphires. Montana is a source of sapphires in the U.S. Sapphires are relatively hard, ranking 9 on the Mohs scale. They have excellent toughness and no cleavage, which is a tendency to break when struck. This makes it a great choice for rings and other mountings subject to daily wear. Sapphires are often heat treated to improve their color or clarity, and the results are permanent, so this is a generally accepted practice in the jewelry business.
